Planning your event

Once you know what you're going to do then its time to get planning. Depending on what you're doing, you will need to decide some things such as where you will hold your event and when. Do you need to invite people or advertise? Social media is a great way to let lots of people know about what you are doing and get some extra support.

Think about how you'll raise the money - you can easily set up your own Just Giving or other fundraising page - where people can donate directly to inclusion.

Make a plan, set a budget and make a checklist of all the things you might need you will also need to think about any risk assessment to ensure your guests are safe.

If youre doing a challenge event, think about organisations that will arrange this and if there are any additional costs to think about.

Most of all have fun and tell us all about it and send us photos to share on our website and social media.
